Preschool

Our award-winning preschool serves as a first and powerful gateway to lasting community connections. The JCC East Bay provides \$100,000 in financial aid for nearly half of the 55 children enrolled, giving families much-needed care and support for this important stage of development.

Afterschool

With programs at the Berkeley JCC and Joaquin Miller Elementary, more than 300 kids experience enhanced learning through educational, physical, artistic, and social-emotional experiences in a welcoming, inclusive environment. Our staff is well-trained in communication, conflict management, and lesson planning to support students with homework, reading a story, painting, or playing an energetic game of soccer. We are also proud to partner with Oakland Unified School District to provide care at no charge for families and students in need.

Summer Camp

Our camp provides a vital outlet for play and connection through traditional camp, art camp, STEM camp, and more. We had a 78% increase in campers this year!



Teens

Whether it be schoolwork, sports, or extracurriculars, we understand how busy a teenager's life can be. From monthly films, dodgeball, and workshops, to competing at the Maccabi Games each summer, we provide ongoing ways to be in community. We challenge and support our youth to be *uber mensches* (Yiddish for a person of great integrity). The Maccabi Games, an Olympic-style sporting competition, is often the first Jewish experience for 66% of the participants!

Family Programs

We meet the evolving needs of our diverse families through meaningful and accessible programs that provide key connections to Jewish traditions, values, and community. With the help of our amazing partners, we served over 1,500 participants with opportunities to learn, share, and celebrate together. We also saw the need for specific identity-based programming and designed pilots to engage Spanish-speaking and Israeli families. The response was overwhelmingly positive, with hundreds of new participants to the JCC East Bay and greater community.

Through JCC ACTS (*Action, Community, Tikkun Olam, and Service*), the JCC East Bay is committed to bringing you ways to get involved in social issues and to make a difference—all while building and strengthening our community. We partner with local, national, and global organizations on collection drives, advocacy efforts, hands-on volunteering, and relationship building with the broader community.

Did you know that nearly 3 in 10 older adults live alone, and 43% regularly experience loneliness? Studies have shown the incredible, positive impact that being in community has on nearly every aspect of life, making socialization that much more important. This is why we have prioritized resuming in-person activities for older adults, and welcomed back Mah Jongg, Yiddish Club, and Israeli Dancing. These experiences create a renewed sense of friendship, care, support, and community where seniors can thrive.

Oakland Expansion

The JCC East Bay is at a pivotal point in our nearly 70-year history. After more than 40 years in our 106-year-old landmark building in Berkeley, we have reached our maximum capacity and ability to fully serve the community's evolving needs. In 2019, we began planning for a flagship JCC in Oakland as the anchor of a visionary Jewish Community Campus that will be home to 15-20 Jewish organizations.

Our vision is to create a Jewish community campus where local organizations will come together in a central location to maximize our resources, amplify our collective impact, and better serve our rich and diverse community.

The East Bay Jewish Community Campus will transform the landscape of our community, and can serve as a pioneer model for Jewish communities across North America.



Jewish Life

From sending videos and letters of support to our sister JCCs in Ukraine, to showcasing Passover charoset from around the world, Jewish life is at the heart of everything we do! In addition to continually sold-out holiday celebrations for families, we partner with local organizations to host some of the largest annual community gatherings. With Jewish Studio Project, we brought more than 1,600 people together for the High Holidays. For Shavuot, we brought 31 organizations, 37 teachers, and 340 community members together for a dynamic day of learning. Every decision we make is influenced and inspired by Jewish values and traditions.
